As the pastor does not grow a church by themselves, neither does an educator teach alone. All of us are responsible for the growth in our whole community. The young and mature offer to one another perspectives and opportunity to learn and grow together.

May we all be instruments of education for one another and offer our full support to those who specialize in equipping for the skills we all need for life.

Something to Chew On

Dear Theophilus,

So, you want to grow your church? Congratulations! You have taken your first step on this amazing journey of transformation. If you want a quick fix, divert the next busload of immigrants to your front door. It helps if they speak your language and are already Lutheran. Given our current Lutheran immigrant shortage, I suggest you start advertising in Sweden or Norway. You

could also start having lots of babies! Just think, if each person in your congregation had one baby you would double your membership in about nine months.

If this plan seems too ambitious, try an attraction-based strategy. Gut your sanctuary and add stadium seating with a stage. Replace scary Halloween music with the latest hits on Christian radio. Install a café. Hire a young, hip pastor with ink sleeves. Consult a professional in advertising and make every event more exciting than the last. Remember, push the bounds of fashion or people will lose interest.

But perhaps you don't have the energy or the budget to seduce the general public with your charms. You could always use high pressure tactics. Go door to door with pamphlets about Jesus. If they try to shut you out, stick your foot in the door. The pain is temporary, but the gain is eternal. Consider calling out the sins of passersby on a busy street corner. You could also take a more subtle approach and systematically dismantle your friends' beliefs with proofs from the Bible. Maybe you're the kind of person who would be more comfortable with the meek and mild approach.

Consider a strategy that relies on friendship and social service. Create a culture of dependency where you give free goods to those in need. Don't talk about the Savior. Be the Savior! Wait to close the deal until they walk through your doors. Then ambush them with a new member's class, a set of offering envelopes, and a role on the church council! Who could say no to that?

If these four time-honored strategies for growing a church do not fit you, simply go where the people are and be a Christian. After all, the only person you can control is you. Express your love of God through worship, study, and a life of reconciliation. Be honest about your faults, and trust God in all things. Healthy growth does not happen through proselytizing which depends on what humans do. Healthy growth comes through evangelizing which proclaims what God has done.




